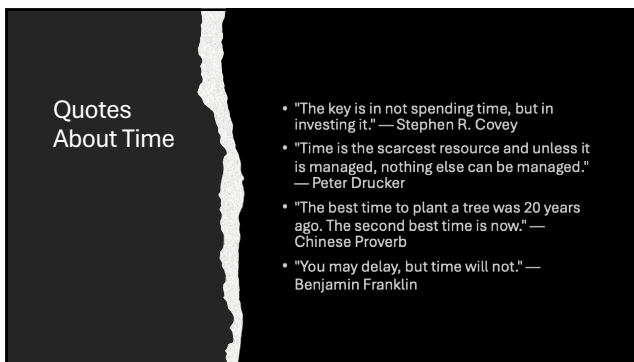
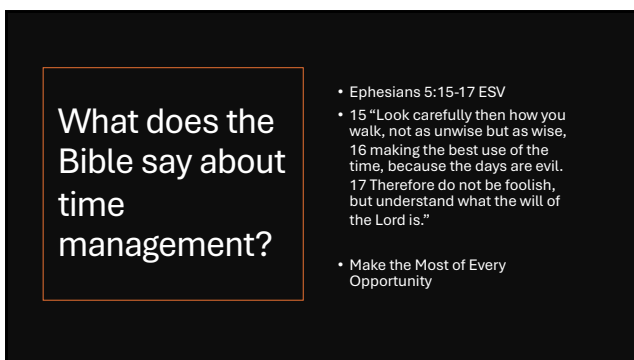

What does the Bible say
about time management?

- Numbering our days: Psalm 90:12 records a prayer asking God to teach humans to number their days so they can gain a heart of wisdom.
- Life as a fleeting vapor: James 4:14 compares human life to a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes, emphasizing that tomorrow is never guaranteed.
- Recognize the Brevity of Life

What does the Bible say about time management?

- Intentional planning: Proverbs 21:5 notes that the plans of the diligent lead to profit, whereas hasty, unplanned actions lead to poverty.
- Submitting plans to God: Proverbs 16:9 establishes that while humans plan their course, it is ultimately the Lord who establishes their steps.
- Execution, Planning, and Diligence

What does the Bible say about task management?

- Planning and foresight: The Bible encourages calculating what it takes to finish a project and gathering resources wisely in advance. For example, Proverbs 21:5 states that the "plans of the diligent lead to profit".
- Diligence and action: Scripture pushes back against procrastination and mere talk. Proverbs 14:23 notes that "all hard work brings a profit, but mere talk leads only to poverty".

What does the Bible say about task management?

- Rhythm of rest: Productivity in the Bible is tied to balance. Just as God rested on the seventh day after creation (Genesis 2:2), you are encouraged to honor boundaries and schedule regular rest to avoid burnout.



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
